Dear Church Family,

Hello,

I hope this letter finds all of you well. I pray for God's peace to be with each and every one of you. Lent is approaching soon. In Korea, during Lent, there is a special 40-day early morning prayer meeting. People gather at the church at 5 a.m. every day for worship, starting their day with prayer for 40 days, participating in the spirit of sharing in the Lord's suffering. As a pastor, I must admit that this period has been quite challenging and difficult for me. Having to attend morning worship every day for 40 days, occasionally delivering sermons as an assistant pastor, and still being a student at the time meant waking up early, offering worship, and studying, sometimes resulting in nosebleeds due to sheer exhaustion. It was so tough that at times, I felt like my tiredness was reaching a whole new level. I felt like I was participating in Lent on a whole new level, the nosebleeds edition.

But on a serious note, this Lenten season has provided me with a unique perspective on the sacrifices and struggles that Jesus faced. It made me appreciate not only the spiritual aspect but also the physical challenges He endured for us. So, while I may joke about the nosebleeds, it's a reminder of the greater sacrifices made for our salvation.

We may not have any special events torturing(?) us during Lent, but as we go through this season, I encourage you to reflect on how much Jesus loved us, how lonely and homeless He was for our sake, and why He had to die for us.

As for me, I am doing well with your prayers and support. Despite some car troubles, it's still running fine, so no need to worry. Please continue to pray for me, that God may work through me, and that Jesus may be the head of our community. I will also pray for all of you every morning. Thank you and much love.
